I tumbled in and out of sleep in my jail cell oddly relieved that it was finally over with! After almost a year and a half sober, I got back on the crazy train heading straight to an all-too-familiar drinking hell and my new DUI put the brakes on. I have been struggling with this alcoholic pattern for over 40 years.

Although it was possible for me to bail out that morning, jail seemed like the perfect place to begin my new journey... quiet (for the most part) and out of the rat race that had become my life. I had time and space to reconnect with my Creator, study my drinking and sobriety cycles plus my triggers, and find out what I was NOT doing to treat my illness. So, I chose to stay in jail awhile. I had to approach it as I would any other disease. What is the medicine? No simple pill... a lifestyle makeover!

Like many others, I have endured, some by bad choices and some by no choice, years of extreme emotional and physical abuse. As a result, my inability to trust became a handicap in repeated attempts to recover. In this crucial life transformation, I have carefully and selectively cultivated relationships with spiritually sound groups and individuals, holding myself accountable, and opening up, to them.

I prayed for God to lead me in my search in designing a life-long recovery mission and I was lead to Alive Again Life Recovery. Here among fellowship of other recovering Christians and a beautiful group of women, I am safe, understood and encouraged. We support each other in our struggles, triumphs and guidance through a Biblically supported 12 steps of recovery. Our facilitator, Marlisa, helps us to discover our God given strengths and encourages us to seek hope and security in what we have in common. I don't just attend; I immerse myself in the experience. Also, just before each meeting I meet with my Stephen's Ministry caregiver for a one-on-one session. She has become a part of Gods plan for me.

As a result of healing I have a new-found respect for myself. My relationships with my grown children and the man I had shared my life of 11 years are recovering beautifully. I have a new relationship with God and belong with a church community. Regardless of how long I have been sober, there will still be times Satan will whisper (or yell) sweet lies to me. I've become equipped with full arsenal to attack him with: prayer, fellowship, people I love, life recovery Bible, Alive Again Life Recovery, and my Stephen's Ministry care giver. I am letting God lead me... Jesus pull me from the wreckage and heal me. I am not the sum of my mistakes. I have been remade.
